

National City Depot as seen circa 1970. At this point in its life, the Depot still had the raised loading dock (and doorway to the Freight Room). An Alco S2 diesel engine #2319 with caboose and boxcars is seen alongside the modified raised loading dock, and a new, narrower doorway leads to the Freight Room. A siding also appears to go around to the other side of the Depot building towards what is now Motivational Systems, Inc. (MSI). The Depot has since been restored to what it looked like from 1882 to 1893, the period of its greatest significance, which was during the operation of the California Southern Railroad. It is also painted in the colors from that period. No Santa Fe logos, nor was a "National City" sign painted on the sides. The San Diego Vintage Trolleys, Inc. (SDVT) volunteers for this month are: Art Aydelotte, Chuck Bencik, Larry Hall, Anthony Carideo, Ron Sutch, Tom Carnes, Dennis Frazier, Paul Kimo McGregor, George Geyer, John Hopperton, John Tarantino, Jr., Bob Recks, and Mark Delia, owner of Citywide Auto Glass, who has donated ALL the glass and installation! The windows for cars #529 and #530 are completely restored and operational. Car #531 is nearly complete with regard to window restoration. The window team is comprised of Window Team Project Leader Chuck Bencik, window team workers: Dennis Frazier, Paul Kimo McGregor, Ron Sutch, Art Aydelotte, and Tom Carnes.

Brackets for attachment of the safety catchers have been installed on all three cars. The fender and body basket for Car #529 are assembled, and the fender has been attached to the car! Bob Recks managed this portion of the project for me, and is assisted by Chuck Bencik, Larry Hall and Dennis Frazier.

Chief Electrician Larry Hall, assistant Journeyman Electrician, Anthony Carideo, and welder Gilbert, from San Diego Trolley, to whom SDVT has budgeted his hours, have gotten all the steel together for the base for the pantograph for #529, and this is an ongoing project for installation, as the fabrication has already been completed. The base for the "pan" is critical, as it abates pitch and yaw when the pantograph is raised or lowered, which will almost never happen. Were it not for this intricate base, the adverse effects of the up and down motion of this device could tears the thin metal of the roof. This is now behind us, and now when we fabricate this same structure for the other two cars, we will have a good deal of experience to work with. The first of anything is always the most difficult, in the learning curve, so to speak. Steel was donated by Larry Hall, Dave Slater, and others who choose not to be named.

Our cars are a veritable "beehive" of activity. More volunteers are always needed! Please think about joining this team. For information, please contact Dave Slater @ (619) 222-5442. Gene Calman has come through for us once again, with regard to fabrication of a post for the headlight bucket for the headlight on #531. Art Aydelotte has been working diligently on this installation, fraught with "bumps". It is industrial archeology at its finest! Not only does Tom Carnes perform our tabulations of volunteer hours on a monthly basis, but also is a worker on the window team. The total volunteer hours ending with June 2008 are: 4,598!!!! THIS IS VERY FAVORABLY IMPRESSIVE!

eral times to facilitate the work, as she is over the pit on Track 3. Every time she goes outside, we get lots of comments from the public. Sergio Lopez (left), master fare box mechanic, and Gary Johnson (below) are working on all of our Johnson fareboxes at

Sergio's shop in Escondido. Roger Jenkins just donated an ORIGINAL Johnson Model D electric fare box and stand from his collection of SDERY artifacts! It was evident that this is an original SDERy item as

the stand is painted the same teal color as the inside of the original cars. WHAT A GREAT DONATION! MANY THANKS ROGER! Gary Johnson came to the car barns this past Saturday to take it to the fare box repair facility.

Each of these fare boxes are priced to sell at only \$100.00 each. We have cleaned and oiled them. There are no keys; however, GRAH Safe and Lock of San Diego is THE railroad locksmith for San Diego for over 100 years, and they can make keys for them. The price is right and they are going fast. I had 5 originally and had planned to use them in our PCC cars, until it was brought to may attention that SDERy ONLY used Johnson Model D's, both electric and mechanical. Being the Museum people that we are with a penchant for absolute authenticity, we must be historically accurate - which is our pledge to all the people of San Diego who will enjoy these PCC cars for many years to come. Every serious collector should have one of these pieces of our street car history. They were originally used on the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority or commonly abbreviated by railfans as LAMTA. Is this our Next Restoration Project After the PCC cars?



While we finish the Vintage Trolleys, we like to collect history, information, photos, parts, or donations. Two recent new photo acquisitions, one from the PSRMA library, include a photo of the 1923 San Diego Electric



Railway White Line Truck as it was being delivered to Pacific Southwest Railroad Museum in Campo in1967. That same truck is now sitting, partially restored, on the north side of the NC Depot lot.

Another photo from the San Diego Historical Society's Ticor Collection shows a San Diego Electric Railway Company horse drawn tower wagon of the 1890s. While the vehicle to the left is not quite the same thing, the horse-drawn line wagon has a similar platform to the one on the White Line Truck.

OWN A PIECE OF SAN DIEGO ELECTRIC RAILWAY HISTORY, **HELP FUND SDERA PROJECTS!**

As many of you know, in June 2007 Chris Chaffee, a member of SDERA, was out for his morning stroll along Adams Avenue. He noticed that some original San Diego Electric Railway (SDERy) trolley track had been exposed during the start of a construction project at the corner of Adams Ave. and Alabama St. The Adams Avenue streetcar barn originally stood across the road from this spot. The building contractors cut the track into pieces and placed them in a pile at the corner of the property. The property owner is Dr. Collin Teguh who agreed to donate pieces of the track to SDERA.

This type of track is called girder rail. Its unique cross-section (see photo below) allowed streetcars to run on city streets that were paved. The pavement came up to the edge of the track, and the trolley wheels rode in the 'dip' on the


top of the rail.

The streetcar line along Adams Avenue was originally built about 1905. However, the whole trolley system was upgraded in 1923. Two pieces of the unearthed track were dated 1922. SDERA and Dr. Teguh each have one of those pieces; ours is on display in the Na-



tional City depot to the left of the trackside doors in the Freight room.

The rest of the track pieces have been cut into 1/2-inch "slices," painted, and engraved with "SDERY 1922." They are being sold by SDERA as a fund-raising
