Thanks to the generosity of some friends of San Diego Electric Railway, our Birney car has some temporary windows—just in time for Winter.

While at The Old Spaghetti Factory, car 357 did not need windows and was protected inside the building. Since acquiring the car last year, members have debated on how to best protect this Birney car body. Last winter, the car was covered with a tarp but this made display of this classic nearly impossible. For air conditioning, the restaurant cut holes in the roof which only let the rain in once the car reached our yard.

Thanks to Charles Smith, Sean McColgan, Jim Anderson, Scotty and Timmy Lewis and Mike Quigg for patching the roof. Using some standard roofing materials, the team got the roof watertight at the end of October—just in time to keep the November rains out.

In early December, we received a donation of some Lucite panels. Initially, the panels were temporarily installed —just enough to keep the weather out. Later, we will have proper sashes made and the Lucite will be cut down to fit in more realistic window frames. Workers included **Dave Slater**, Mike Quigg, and Charles Smith, **Pete Pearson**, and **Art Adeylotte**. Thanks to the Chule Lumber for some wood to help segure the

We still need to build the bi-fold doors and **Chuck Bencik** has been looking at some interim solutions that will allow us to protect the car and still allow access for visitors.

SDERA TROLLEY LINES

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Things have been picking up at San Diego Vintage Trolley. The addition of a few new volunteers brought some fresh energy to the efforts.

Cars 1123 and 1170 have been moved and a workbench has been provided between Tracks 1 & 2 in Building A. **Ron Sutch**, **Chuck Bencik**, and **Dave Slater** removed all the broken windows from car 1122 (lots!) and started removing broken ones from 1170. **Marc Weaver**– SDVT member and MTS employee- joined to help remove the broken door glass on car 1170. Thanks to SDERA member Gene Calman for his generous donation to fund a special order from Accurate Elastomeric of San Diego for new window channels. Gene often gets parts made for his automobile restorations and they gave us a great price.

Since car 1170 is over the pit, a proper boarding ramp was fashioned from some catwalk that was available. This was carefully wired to the track to prevent movement.

Art Aydelotte—ship's carpenter for the U.S.S. Midway aircraft carrier floating museum and member of both SDERA and SDVT—used his skills to

fabricate a new battery tray for car 1122. He used redwood that was cut and milled in his shop aboard the ship. Art has also taken on the task of replacing the wooden end window molding for each car. He has made a template so he can get a good fit. The molding was originally steam bent similar to caned furniture but this process is no longer generally available. New member **Jeff Saar**, also a woodworker, will build a steam box to make the bends. Thanks to Chuck Bencik for referring Jeff from the Maritime Museum.


Painting Complete at N.C. Depot

2006 has been a year of catching up on some deferred maintenance and we're pleased to announce that all of the necessary repairs have been completed! We've done electrical work, deck refinishing, plumbing, and a complete set of safety inspections. The only thing left was to remedy the weather-worn doors on the north and west sides of the building.

Patriot Painting of Ramona won the bid to paint the outside structure and varnish the doors and thresholds. They also sealed a crack at the "belly band" on the building that developed on the south wall of the Depot when it was lifted during foundation work when the Depot was restored.

Many of our doors showed significant weather damage and we were not able to get them back to perfect condition. However, the overall results were quite good. The wood is protected again and we are ready for the winter rains. Thanks Patriot Painting!
